Membership Cards! Got it? Be ready to show it. We are checking and probably rechecking everyone. With the completion of the new bar we are signing up new members every day. There are a lot of new faces. Don't take offense when we ask to see your membership card. You should be proud to show it. It is a privilege to be a member of the American Legion. It is the law that we only sell alcohol to Legion members. The bartenders are only looking out for what's best for the Post.

No more "Andy will vouch for me." or "I just showed the other bartender". The bartenders are trained to card everyone they don't recognize as a current member. We don't have any data base to where can look up every one of our 3,200 current members either. Plain and simple, if you don't have your current card on you, we can't serve you alcohol.

We are working on getting the pizza situation. It will still be a few weeks before they are available, because we are still waiting on a few things. The pizza oven will be set up in the kitchen by the double doors. They will be available if there is no dinner being served from the kitchen, the bartenders are not too busy behind the bar or volunteers would like to help cook them. I will let you know as soon as we are ready to start serving them again.

This month's wine feature is a chardonnay from Chateau Ste Michelle. This chardonnay offers apple and pear fruit character with bright natural acidity. This lightly oaked wine goes well with food. It is \$3.50 by the glass or \$12 for the bottle.
