CHAPLAINS CORNER

On December 22, 1944, through a party consisting of a major, captain, and two privates under a flag of truce, General Heinrich Freiherr von Lüttwitz sent the following ultimatum to Gen. McAuliffe who's 101st Division was desperately holed up at Bastogne, surrounded and greatly outnumbered by the Germans . . .

"To the U.S.A. Commander of the encircled town of Bastogne.

The fortune of war is changing. This time the U.S.A. forces in and near Bastogne have been encircled by strong German armored units. More German armored units have crossed the river Our near Ortheuville, have taken Marche and reached St. Hubert by passing through Hompre-Sibret-Tillet. Libramont is in German hands. There is only one possibility to save the encircled U.S.A. troops from total annihilation: that is the honorable surrender of the encircled town. In order to think it over a term of two hours will be granted beginning with the presentation of this note.

If this proposal should be rejected one German Artillery Corps and six heavy A. A. Battalions are ready to annihilate the U.S.A. troops in and near Bastogne. The order for firing will be given immediately after this two hours' term.

All the serious civilian losses caused by this artillery fire would not correspond with the well known American humanity."

General McAuliffe's unorthodox and now infamous reply . . .

"To the German Commander, "NUTS!" The American Commander."

'Gotta love tenacity in the face of adversity! So the next time you feel surrounded and outnumbered by the circumstances of life, try shouting out "NUTS TO THIS"! I'm sure the late general wouldn't mind if you borrowed his line!

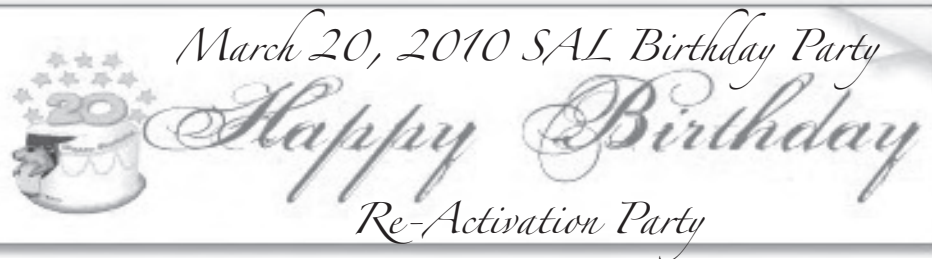


