Americanism is an essential part of what the American Legion stands for. A shining example of this trait was found within a local family, the Rathsburg's.



Norton Shores residents, Bonny, Jerry and Kim have family deployed in our most recent conflict. LCPL Adam Dickie and other Marines are currently stationed in northern Afghanistan, where so much of the tough fighting is ongoing. When on patrol, these soldiers are away from their base camp for three weeks at a time. They fight the cold of the mountains of 8,000 ft with little or no contact with the outside world. The living conditions they encounter on patrol do not have running water, washing facilities, or much warmth. When Adam was deployed in September he and his unit requested a list of items to help them endure their time away from home. The items included are personal care items, snacks, socks, powdered drink mixes and hand warmers. The Rathsburgs have taken it upon themselves to ensure not only Adam - but the others serving with him had all they needed. Through personal purchases and small donations of items this family has sent 7 boxes to Adam and a few other soldiers they found were not receiving packages from home. Each package had a note of thanks for their service enclosed. When the holidays approached Kim reached out to her co-workers at Meijer to help. There was an overwhelming response - and the family was able to create 17 additional boxes from their remaining purchases and the co-workers contributions. With some help from Adam's mom - they acquired

more addresses - and have now sent packages to 13 different Marines serving in different areas of Afghanistan. The Rathsburgs have reached out to our Post for assistance to ensure their efforts can continue. We here at the Post will help as we can. Let us all remember all of our service men and women who are so very far from home and often in harms way. If you are interested in helping the Rathsburgs keep the boxes going, please contact any of the Officers within our Legion Post family. Thank You, Carl Lori Service Officer
