Our Friday night burgers have become quite the event. Our burgers are so good that it has even attracted a few celebrities. Bad Bad LeRoy Brown, Moe & Curley, John-Boy, Willie Wonka, Justin Beiber & Bathesheba are just a few. If you don't know the routine, you fill out a burger slip with your name on it. When its done the kitchen will call out your name. Some other good ones are "My lights are on", "What's on that plate" and my favorite "Oh my God". Oh my God... your burgers are done.

Burgers are served from 6pm to 8pm (unless we run out). We average about 200 per night. Our record is 380... 380! That's more than 3 burgers being served every minute for 2 hours! Impressive! I don't think I have seen that crew back here since.

We are always looking for crews to cook burgers. A crew should consist of about 6 people, maybe a couple more during the summer. We have experienced crews that will help train any new crew interested in helping. It's a great time, a great way to help the Post & a great way to get involved.

We have added a chicken breast sandwich to our burger night menu. They are \$4 each. The single burgers are \$3 & the doubles are \$4. They are served with a bag of chips, a plate & a smile. The condiments are for the burgers only. They are not for making salads! Any complaints can be brought to the bar. We'll put you to work in the kitchen.
