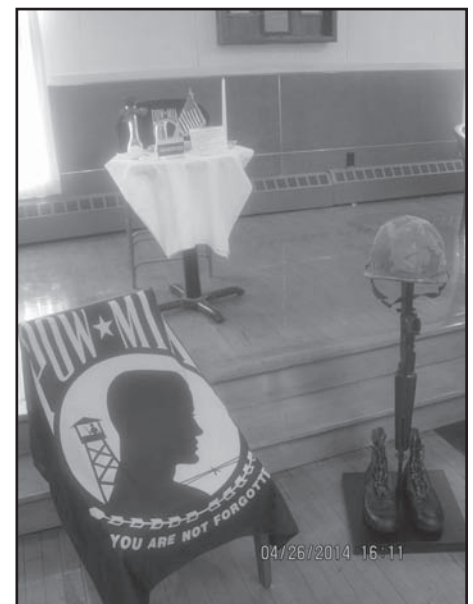

A few people have asked about the origins of the 8 & 40 group at our Legion. The original national group began in 1922 as a sister organization to the 40/8 mens group of the American Legion. The 40/8 title of officers was taken from the French railway system of 40 men and 8 horses in one box car. The 8 & 40 group also used French titles. The group decided since they no longer had a connection with the railway they would use titles related to hats, which were very popular at the time. The first National Chapeau was known as Le Grand Chapeau. The group was dedicated to uphold the ideals of God and Country and developed into doing charitable work for Veterans and their families.
