As a former Air Force Chaplain it pains me to recount this story, but the message is so good that I'll put aside "service rivalry" just this once!

Four military recruiters showed up to address high school seniors at a school assembly. Each recruiter representing the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps - was to have fifteen minutes to speak. Unfortunately the Army, Navy, and Air Force recruiters got a little long winded, so when it came time for the Marine to speak he had but two minutes to deliver his talk. Curiously, the Marine walked up to the podium, stared at the audience, and remained completely silent for his first ninety seconds. 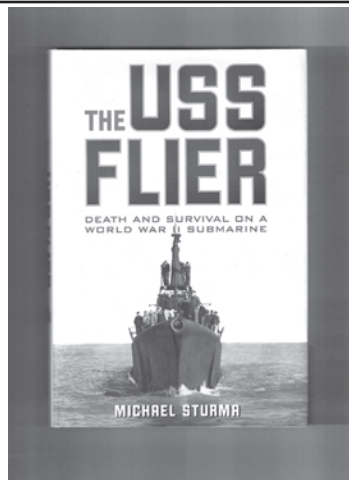

**WWII Submarine Found "USS Flier"**

Hi everyone, Two copies of a book have been donated to the Legion by the family of one of our past members Alvin E. Jacobson. The book is *The USS Flier Death and Survival on a World War II Submarine*. "The fate of the USS Flier is one of the most astonishing stories of the Second World War. On August 13, 1944, the submarine struck a mine and sank to the bottom of the Sulu Sea in less than one minute, leaving only fourteen of its crew of eighty-six hands alive. After enduring eighteen hours in the water, eight remaining survivors swam to a remote island controlled by the Japanese. Deep behind enemy lines and without food or drinking water, the crewmen realized that their struggle for survival had just begun." Alvin E. Jacobson was one of the men that was on the USS Flier. He shared his memoirs and memories to help write this book. These books will be at the Legion in the office so you can sign them out. Check with the Post Manager. The Post had an opportunity recently to help out a local group that contributes a great deal to our veterans. Elizabeth Clark and the Lighthouse Quilt Guild design, sew and stuff beautiful red, white and blue quilts for the Quilts of Valor Foundation.

The Quilts of Valor Foundation was founded and is run by people that want to say "Thank you" to our servicemen and women in a more tangible way. Elizabeth and her crew of about 8 volunteers from the Lighthouse Quilt Guild donate around 200 hand sewn quilts every year through the QOV Foundation. These quilts are then given to our servicemen and women that are either in wheelchairs or bedridden in hospitals like Walter Reed in Washington DC. These quilts help give warmth and comfort to veterans during times when they need it most.

Each quilt is 55" x 65" in size and use \$60 worth of materials. The Lighthouse Quilt Guild does accept fabric or monetary donations to help offset any out of pocket expenses.
