Saturday March 19th we will be hosting a benefit for Aaron Biros. Aaron is 10 years old and suffers from ataxia-telangiectasia (or AT). AT is a rare genetic disease that attacks 1 in 40,000 kids. It is a disease that affects their coordination, immune systems and predisposes them to fatal cancers. Kids with AT usually lose their ability to walk by the age of 10, many may not survive their teens and rarely survive their twenties.

We will be serving a spaghetti dinner from 5-7pm. We have 250 dinner tickets available. Tickets are \$7 for adults, \$5 for kids 5-12 and kids under 5 eat for free. There will also be a beer and wine tasting and an ice cream bar. Upstairs there will be raffles, 50/50s and all sorts of auctions. The proceeds will help fund specific research to find life-improving therapies and a cure for AT.
