COMMANDER'S COMMENTS

As I write this at the Post in mid-April, a cold rain is falling with more promised every day this week.

Wherever you read

this, I hope you are enjoying warm, sunny May weather.

Phase II of our Post Improvement Project (PIP) -- the renovation of our new lounge and dining area and entrances -- is progressing on schedule. The basic bar is framed and closed in and the overhead recessed lighting makes the scene look warm and inviting. At this very moment, the new flooring is being laid down. If you are not able to come in and see our progress, check us out on Facebook. There Andy VanderHoek, Club Manager and PIP team member, has posted a progression of photos taken at various stages of the renovation.

We continue to be blessed and very thankful for the dozens of Post-member volunteers who help with dry-wall and painting projects, most notably in the new foyer, plus the Building and Grounds crews who have been doing the almost daily tasks of moving heavy furniture and materials in and out of the dining and Post meeting rooms to accommodate the construction process. These efforts have enabled us to save a great deal of money, plus continue to hold our basic Post Legion, Auxiliary, SAL and Riders meetings that help make this place run. We also appreciate our customers who have adjusted to and continued to patronize our temporary lounge (on the second floor veranda with the friendliest staff and "best view in town") throughout the construction period. (I know, "tough duty", but somebody has to do it.) Hopefully, by the time you read this, the weather will have permitted opening the deck areas as well.

All the contractors should be out of the Post by Friday, April 26th, and, as Andy noted, "That will give us a week to clean, move, paint, stock and touch up before the opening." The latter promises to be quite a task, especially removing all the dust that has settled throughout the main floor areas. We plan to hold a Grand Opening Ceremony in the new Club Room on Friday,

May 3rd, 2 pm. Based on what we have seen thus far, and comments we have received in person and/or on Facebook, we think you will be pleased with our new entrances and Club Room and find the wait, cost and effort to have been well worthwhile, especially when the summer crowds arrive.
