Legionnaires: On July 26, 2007 U. S. Senator Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) praised the passage by unanimous consent of his bill (S. 1877) clarifying U.S. law to allow veterans and servicemen not in uniform to salute the flag. Current law (US Code Title 4, Chapter 1) states that a veteran and servicemen not in uniform should place their hand over their heart without clarifying whether they can or should salute the flag. As you can see by this passage you now are able to salute the flag in or out of uniform. The salute of the flag is a form of honor and respect, representing pride of one's service to their country, and we all know that the flag is a simple of our fine country.
