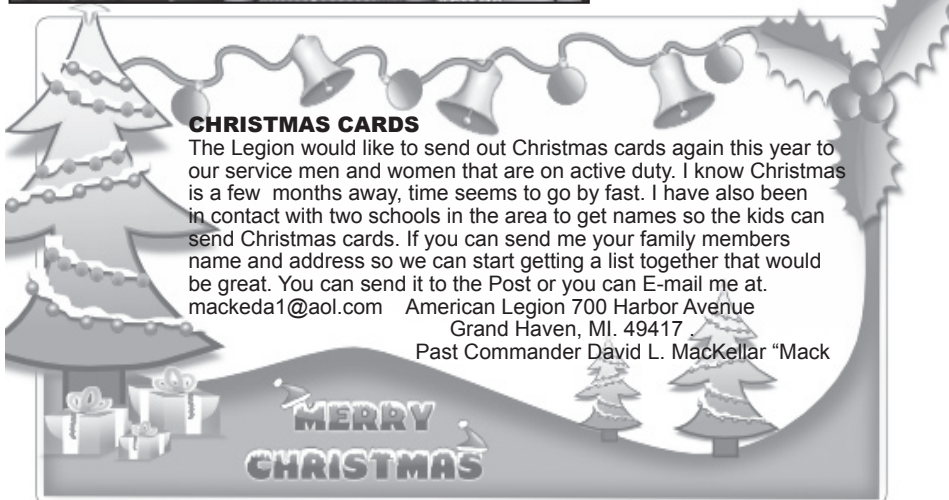
CHRISTMAS CARDS
