Tabs for Tots is a program that the American Legion started in 1989. The program converts aluminum tabs saved from beverage cans into cash grants that are distributed to medical facilities throughout Michigan to purchase equipment or pay for medical needs for children. Michigan Legions have generated grants totaling over \$327,000 for more than 176 pieces of equipment. Recently Shelly Segal (Jack & Dona Robinson's niece), a nurse at Med-Surg Intermediate Intensive Care Unit in Palo Alto California, challenged two other units from her veteran's hospital to see who could collect the most tabs. The result was a collection of more than 13 pounds of tabs. To put this collection into perspective it takes 1000 tabs to equal one pound. That's impressive.

Thank you to all those who do contribute to the program. There are a lot of you. Anyone collecting them can bring them here to the Post. It is not too early to renew your dues. Please be ready to show your card. Don't be offended if you are asked to show it. It is a privilege to be an American Legion member. Be proud.
