At the Friday Fish Boil, put on by the SAL, we cooked 400 lbs. of salmon, 200 lbs. of potatoes, 100 lbs. of onions, and 12 bushels of corn (and a lot of melted butter)! We served dinner to close to 1000 people, and had to cut off ticket sales because we ran low on fish. We had the same amount of fish last year, and had some to spare, so we definitely had a much better turn out this year.

At the Saturday evening Entertainment Tent, we also had a huge crowd show up to enjoy a few drinks and dance to the ever-popular Soul'd Out...a far larger turnout than the year before.

Salmon Festival is a great fundraiser for the SAL, and everything we raise gets spent on the Legion, local charities, the Grand Rapids' Veterans Home, and many other worthwhile Veteran's causes.
